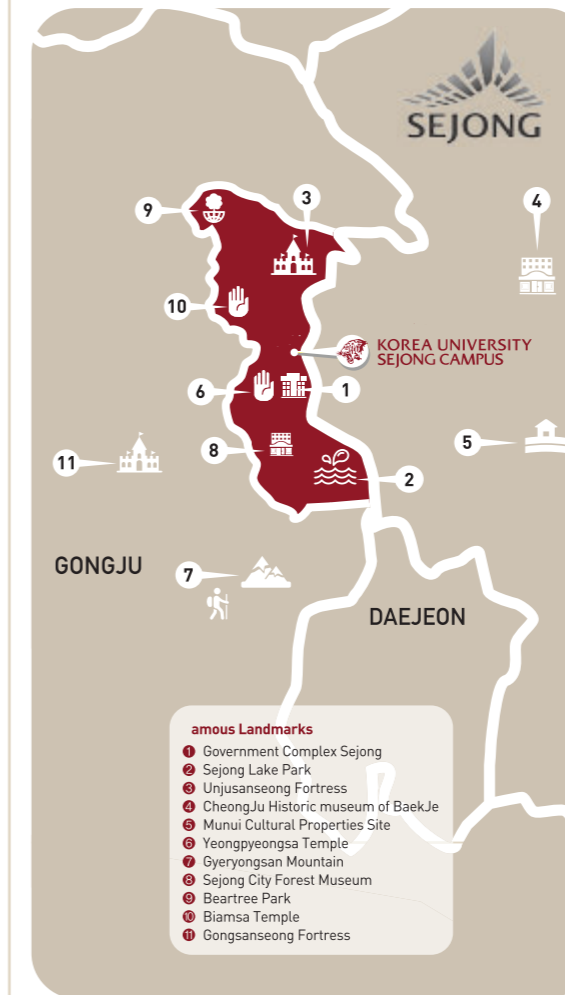

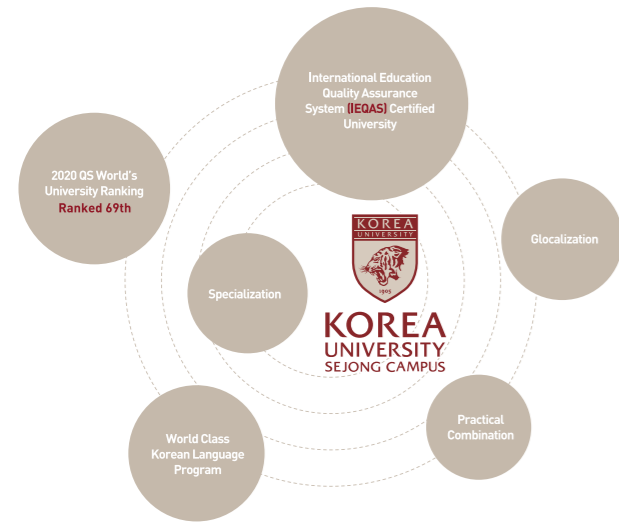

Undergraduate Admissions Guide

1 Eligibility and Requirements

A. Citizenship/Academic Requirements

1) Freshman (first year) student

Applicant must meet one of the following requirements:

- a. A non-Korean citizen applicant with non-Korean citizen parent(s), who has completed (or is expected to complete) regular high school/secondary education in Korea or overseas.

2) Transfer Student

Applicant must meet one of the following requirements:

Third-year transfer A non-Korean citizen applicant with non-Korean citizen parent(s)	The applicant must complete regular primary and secondary education, equivalent to Grade 1 to 12 in Korean education system, either in Korea or overseas. The applicant must have an academic record of minimum 2 years completed in an undergraduate program at a regular four-year university or be an (expected) graduate from a 2 or 3 year college.
Second-year transfer A non-Korean citizen applicant with non-Korean citizen parent(s)	The applicant must complete regular primary and secondary education, equivalent to Grade 1 to 12 in Korean education system, either in Korea or overseas. The applicant must have an academic record of minimum 1 year completed in an undergraduate program at a regular four-year university or be an (expected) graduate from a 2 or 3 year college.
Third-year transfer A non-Korean citizen applicant with Korean citizen parent(s)	The applicant must complete regular primary and secondary education overseas and have an academic record of minimum 2 years completed in an undergraduate program at a regular four-year university or be an (expected) graduate from a 2 or 3 year college
Second-year transfer A non-Korean citizen applicant with Korean citizen parent(s)	The applicant must complete regular primary and secondary education overseas and have an academic record of minimum 1 year completed in an undergraduate program at a regular four-year university or be an (expected) graduate from a 2 or 3 year college

Notice about "Citizenship"

- Citizenship status is determined at the time of application submission.
- A Korean citizen who holds dual citizenship cannot apply as an international student.
- If an applicant oneself and the applicant's parent(s) were Korean citizen but renounced Korean citizenship, one of the official documents must be provided as evidence:
 - Certificate of Loss of Korean citizenship
 - Family Register Certificate
 - Any other official proof of document
- If an applicant has a single parent, the legal parent's citizenship will be considered for the applicant's eligibility.
- In order to be eligible for "a non-Korean citizen applicant with non-Korean citizen parent(s)", the applicant and applicant's parent(s) must have obtained citizenship of another country before high school

B. Language Proficiency Requirements For both freshmen and second-year transfer applicants:

- 1) A score report of the Test of Proficiency in Korean (TOPIK / TOPIK iBT regular test) * TOPIK iBT Trial Test Score is NOT acceptable.
- 2) A certificate of level completion and transcripts from the Korean Language Intensive Program (KLIP) at Korea University Sejong Campus or a Korean language institute at other universities in Korea.
- 3) A certificate of completion from King Sejong Institute or Sejong Korean Language Assessment (SKA)
- 4) Applicants who have passed one of the following accredited English language exams: TOEFL(iBT), IELTS Academic.
- 5) For applicants who have completed the entire curriculum of secondary education with Korean or English as their primary language of instruction, official high school transcripts may be submitted as an alternative.

Third-year transfer:

- 1) Applicants who have passed at least TOPIK (TOPIK / TOPIK iBT regular test) Level 3 * TOPIK iBT Trial Test Score is NOT acceptable.
- 2) Applicants who have successfully completed at least the Level 3 of the Korean Language Intensive Program (KLIP) at Korea University Sejong Campus; or at a Korean language institute affiliated to other universities in Korea.

C. Qualification for Examination Standard

- 1) Only schools located outside of Korea are regarded as schools overseas. International schools located in Korea will not be considered the same as schools overseas.
- 2) Other qualification examinations taken in Korea or overseas, homeschooling, online courses, or language schools, and so on from the level of primary, secondary to higher education are not regarded as regular school curriculum.

2. How your application is assessed: 100% Based on Submitted Documents (Department of Pharmacy: documents and interview)

Evaluation is based on the submitted application and supporting documents only, assessing the applicant's academic ability, aptitude for their field of interest, language competency, academic and extra-curricular activities, and so on.

3. Options for Majors/Minors

A. Mandatory (Please choose one)

- 1) Double Major:
 - Fulfill the graduation requirements of the first major
 - Take all core courses required for the second major
- 2) Interdisciplinary Major:
 - Fulfill the graduation requirements of the first major
 - Take all core courses required in a program which is a combination of at least two different majors
- 3) Student-Designed Major:
 - Fulfill the graduation requirements of the first major
 - Creates your own customized curriculum in consultation with your mentor professor under the approval of the president of Korea University
- 4) Intensive Major:
 - Fulfill the graduation requirements of the first major
 - Take additional courses in the first major-related department

B. Electives

Dual Degree: Complete eight semesters of study for the first major (fulfill graduate requirements) and pursue a second major for one semester or more

4. Intensive Korean Language Program and Restrictions on Major Course Enrollment

Admitted students may be subject to obligatory General Korean Language Training and Restrictions on Major Course Enrollment based on the submitted TOPIK score or the KLIP* level completed at the The Sejong Institute of International Affairs and Education at Korea University Sejong Campus.

* KLIP: Korean Language Intensive Program offered at The Sejong Institute of International Affairs and Education
* Applicants lower than TOPIK 3 should take 2-3 semesters of obligatory training and pass at least TOPIK 3. If someone who can't pass the TOPIK 3, it may be replaced with certificate of completion of 3 level from KLIP or score of the Korean Language Proficiency Test run by the Korea University Sejong Campus.

5. Exchange Student Program

To cultivate world-class leaders of the globalization era, students may choose to study for a semester or two at one of Korea University Sejong Campus' partner universities that are known to be leading institutions of higher education around the world. Aside from learning the local language and culture, you can also transfer the credits you earned abroad to your academic transcript
